4- select faithful men to be part of a ministry/leadership team

teamwork teaching/preaching/doctrine world vision

5- delegate responsibilities to each person

plan	organize	lead	evaluate
<i>objectives</i> What is the goal? (be specific)	define responsibilities	get them started	Goal completed effectively?
<i>activities</i> What activities can I do to meet the goal?	delegate responsibilities	serve them	What worked? What didn't?
<i>resources</i> What resources do I need to meet the goal?	hold them accountable	encourage them	Was anything missing?
<i>schedule</i> how? when? who? where?	help them finish well	help them develop a servant's heart	Suggestions to improve?
