

THE GOSPEL: A DEFINITION




GOD CREATED YOU AND HE LOVES YOU



WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO REALLY BELIEVE?

Paul's Personal Story of Salvation

Read how Paul shared his personal story with King Agrippa in Acts 26:1-29. Then answer the following questions:

YOUR PERSONAL STORY OF SALVATION

Now that you have seen the example of Paul, work on sharing your own story. Sharing how you came to faith in Christ can be one of the best ways to share the Gospel with others, especially with family and friends.

When you share your personal story remember these points:

- Make it personal. Don't preach. Share what Christ has done in your life. Use the pronouns "I, me, my," not "you."
- Make it brief. Three or four minutes is enough to share the most important elements.
- Keep Jesus in the forefront, focusing on what He has done in your life.
- Use the Word of God. One or two verses of Scripture will add power to your story. The Bible is the sword of the Spirit!

Prepare your personal story

- Write your personal testimony on the following page as you would share it with a non-believer. It should give a clear idea of how that person can put personal faith in Christ.
- Share a little about your life before you trusted in Christ; then, how you believed; finally, how your faith transformed your life. Include the blessing of having your sin forgiven, the assurance of eternal life, or some other important change.
- If you have been a believer for many years, be sure to share some recent ways God is working in your life.
- As you prepare your story, ask the Lord to give you someone to share with. Pray for two or three people in your spheres of influence that God has put on your heart. Let them know what God has done in your life. Pray and share as God gives you opportunity.

In conclusion, remember that you cannot convince anyone in your own power. The Holy Spirit is the one who convinces non-Christians of their need for Christ (John 16:8.) When you pray for those with whom you wish to share, ask God to work through the proclamation of His Word and convince them of their need to put their faith in Christ.

REMEMBER THESE POINTS

- We are witnesses of what we have seen and heard. We are witnesses of our personal relationship with God.
- We can share through our actions of love, our lifestyle of walking with God, and through our verbal testimony.
- Paul's testimony gives a clear outline that we can follow. Briefly share about your life before knowing Christ, about how you came to put personal faith in Him, and something of how God has worked in your life since believing in Him.

ILLUSTRATIONS AND STORIES TO COMMUNICATE TRUTH

WHATEVER BECAME OF EVANGELISM?

Now it came to pass that a group existed who called themselves fishermen. And lo, there were many fish in the waters all around. In fact the whole area was surrounded by streams and lakes filled with fish. And the fish were hungry. Week after week, month after month, and year after year, those who called themselves fishermen met in meetings and talked about their call to fish, the abundance of fish, and how they might go about fishing. Year after year they carefully defined what fishing means, defended fishing as an occupation, and declared that fishing is always to be a primary task of fishermen.

These fishermen built large, beautiful buildings for local fishing headquarters. The plea was that everyone should be a fisherman and every fisherman should fish. One thing they didn't do, however: they didn't fish.

In addition to meeting regularly, they organized a board to send out fishermen to other places where there were many fish. The board was formed by those who had the great vision and courage to speak about fishing, to define fishing, and to promote the idea of fishing in faraway streams and lakes where many other different kinds of fish lived. Also the board hired staffs and appointed committees and held many meetings to define fishing, to defend fishing, and to decide what new streams should be considered. But the staff and committee members did not fish.

Large, elaborate, and expensive training centers were built whose original and primary purpose was to teach fishermen how to fish. Over the years courses were offered on the needs of the fish, the nature of fish, how to define fish, the psychological reactions of fish, and how to approach and feed fish. Those who taught had doctorates in "fishology." But the teachers did not fish. They only taught fishing.

Further, the fishermen built large printing houses to publish fishing guides. Presses were kept busy day and night to produce materials solely devoted to fishing methods, equipment, and programs, to arrange and encourage meetings to talk about fishing. A speakers'

bureau was also provided to schedule special speakers on the subject of fishing.

After one stirring meeting on "The Necessity of Fishing," one young fellow left the meeting and went fishing. The next day he reported that he had caught two outstanding fish. He was honored for his excellent catch and scheduled to visit all the big meetings possible to tell how he did it. So he quit his fishing in order to have time to tell about the experience to the other fishermen. He was also placed on the Fisherman's General Board as a person having considerable experience. Now it's true that many of the fishermen sacrificed and put up with all kinds of difficulties. Some lived near the water and bore the smell of dead fish. They received the ridicule of some who made fun of their fishermen's clubs and the fact that they claimed to be fishermen yet never fished. They wondered about those who felt it was of little use to attend and talk about fishing. After all, were they not following the Master who said, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matt. 4:19)?

Imagine how hurt some were when one day a person suggested that those who don't fish were not really fishermen, no matter how much they claimed to be. Yet it did sound correct. Is a person a fisherman if year after year he never catches a fish?
